Auxiliary donates \$60,000 to KDH

On March 28, KDH Auxiliary President Lillian Leonard presented a cheque for \$60,000 to KDH CEO Colin Goodfellow. (See photo on the left.) The donation will purchase a video colonoscope, a central monitor station and a patient lift.

With this cheque, the Auxiliary has donated over \$939,000 to purchase equipment at the hospital since the KDHA was founded in 1959. In addition, we are on track to raise \$100,000 for the mammography fund.

This year's donation exceeds last year's record \$50,000 contribution, an increase that reflects the growth in revenue from the new gift shop and coffee bar.

Fast Facts about Mammography at KDH

Mammograms save lives: early detection of breast cancer provides the best chance of survival.

Since October 2011, women in the Kemptville area and surrounding region have a local alternative at Kemptville District Hospital, equal in quality to mammography in other centres like Winchester or Ottawa, and certainly more convenient.

The mammography suite at KDH uses new, state of the art digital mammography technology. KDH's Medical Radiation Technologists have additional training, education and experience in mammography and are registered with the College of Medical Radiation Technologists of Ontario.

If you've previously had a mammogram elsewhere, it's easy for your records to be transferred to KDH.

You can be referred by your family doctor, or you can self-refer: women 50-74 can book their mammograms directly by calling 613-258-6133 extension 400, option 5.

You will receive your results through your family doctor. KDH sends you a reminder when it's time for your next mammogram.

KDH Communication Officer Jenny Read says, "at KDH we strive to make every mammogram as comfortable and convenient as possible, with spa robes, kind and caring technologists, warm digital detectors and extended hours. KDH adopted this 'spa' approach to remove barriers to

women getting life-saving screening mammograms."
